Culverts/Water Drainage Issues

A culvert is a drain or pipe that allows water to flow under a road, railroad, trail or similar obstruction. Most homes have culverts running underneath their driveway. The County has culverts under County roads to assist with drainage also. If you are having drainage issues at or near your home our Road Foreman can help evaluate the situation and determine the best course of action. There is no charge to the homeowner for this service.

New installation or Replacement Culvert

Culverts range in price according to size and material. The property owner is responsible for purchasing the appropriate size and grade for the property needs. The District 3 office can provide information regarding local culvert retailers.

The standard FEMA-approved culvert size is a minimum of 12” in diameter and 20’ in length for the typical home. Driveways with heavy traffic, oversized loads or farm equipment should have a larger and/or longer culvert. Appropriate allowances for drainage should always be a primary consideration. If the culverts on either side of the property are larger, you should install a similar size to maintain drainage constancy.

After you have purchased the culvert, call the District 3 office. We will create a work order, request a utility locate, pick the culvert up from the supplier and install it with the necessary materials. Allow a minimum of three to eight weeks or more for installation, depending on the season. There is no charge to the homeowner for the installation service.

*PLEASE NOTE: The County can only perform drainage maintenance and/or install culverts within County right of way. Repair/replacement of cement or other ornamental driveway materials is the responsibility of the property owner.

Solid Waste Disposal Program

This is a free, year-round program for County residents to dispose of household items from their private residence, which is of no use to charity organizations but too large for normal trash service pick-up. It is not available for commercial operations, rental property management or other profit-related services. You must provide a valid driver’s license showing your Rogers County address. The goal of the Solid Waste Disposal Program is to provide a service for County residents and reduce the amount of rural dumping.

ACCEPTED: Household items too large for normal trash service pick-up, from your private residence, which are of no use to charity organizations such as large furniture, mattresses, carpeting, home remodeling debris, T.V.s, appliances with refrigerants or CFCs removed, car and truck tires with rims removed, tree branches, tree stumps but NO bagged leaves or grass.

NOT ACCEPTED: We do NOT accept anything in trash bags because if it is small enough to fit in a trash bag it will fit in your trash can. We do not accept any sort of household garbage, leaves, paint, batteries, oil, dead animals, caustic or hazardous chemicals or materials of any kind, materials containing asbestos, cylinders or other containers of compressed gas, containers with oil, gasoline, diesel fuel or hydrocarbons, or other problematic products.
