1. Discussion with possible action on Approval of naming of 11-person committee to consider the needs, possible solutions and financing for the Rogers County Courthouse, Rogers County Jail, as well as a County-wide E911 Dispatch Facility and report findings to the Board of County Commissioners regarding the same – (***NOTE***this item was discussed at June 22, 2009, meeting***) -

Chairman Helm stated that this item was placed back on the agenda from last week, because each commissioner was to find to people two (2) people to serve on this committee and name their persons today and the judges were to name their five (5).

Commissioner Thacker named Jim Smith, from Musgrove-Merriott-Smith Funeral Service & Crematory and himself, Kirt Thacker; Commissioner Dan DeLozier named Larry Mallory and John Baker; Chairman Helm named Ted Jones and Craig Meyers; and Judge Shelia Condren named Bill Higgins from the Oklahoma Bar Association; Sheriff Scott Walton; Judge Dewayne Steidley; Claremore Chief of Police, Mickey Perry and Judge Shelia Condren, which all have been contacted and agree to serve.

Judge Condren stated that the first meeting is scheduled for Thursday, July 9, 2009, at 6:00 P.M. in Judge Condren's courtroom.

Chairman Helm made a motion to confirm all appointments named today with Commissioner Thacker seconding the motion. Roll Call: Helm-aye, Thacker-aye, DeLozier-aye. Motion carried.

2. Discussion with possible action on Approval of Resolution #2009-40 for participation in the Metropolitan Tulsa HOME Consortium for another three-year period for fiscal year 2010-2012 and authorizing execution of the Cooperation Agreement –

Andy Armstrong with INCOG was present at the meeting and explained that this is either the 5th or 6th time the Board has been asked to re-authorize this participation agreement. About fifteen (15) years ago The Department of Housing & Urban Development created a separate housing funding program called "The Home Program" and a consortium was put together that consists of six (6) counties and Tulsa County is the lead organization. These funds go to help support elderly housing projects. We do first-time home buyer assistance with this program and we work through the Community Action Agency in Claremore.

Armstrong recommended to the Board approval of the resolution and cooperation agreement as presented. Commissioner Thacker made a motion to approve with Commissioner DeLozier seconding the motion. Roll Call: Helm-aye, Thacker-aye, DeLozier-aye. Motion carried.

3. Discussion with possible action on insurance proposal of property and liability with Association of County Commissioners (ACCO) representative Dusty Birdsong –

Dusty Birdsong with ACCO-SIG presented a proposal for Rogers County and Rogers County Criminal Justice Authority. The property/liability deductible quote was \$25,000; deductible's stop @ \$75,000; deductible fund account is \$75,000; liability premium \$98,149; property premium \$59,425; with a total for fiscal year 2009-2010 of \$232,574. ACCO-SIG's quote includes liability coverage on an occurrence basis on general liability; automobile liability; law enforcement liability; and employment practices liability. ACCO-SIG's quote includes property coverage's on an occurrence basis on all vehicles, trucks, and road equipment which is covered on a market value basis; all real property and contents is covered on a replacement cost basis at 125% of the value on the property schedule at the time of the loss; no additional premium charged for adding buildings, equipment, and vehicles and trucks during the policy term, property premium fixed for entire fiscal year; blanket coverage for all buildings, equipment, and vehicles and trucks, no pentaly for failure to add. Price quotes also includes flood insurance. Deductible exposures are fully funded; all claims within deductible would be fully funded from your deductible fund account.

Birdsong reported that the ACCO-SIG 2009-2010 property and liability quote for Rogers County Criminal Justice Authority on property/liability deductible be \$10,000; deductible's stop @ \$50,000; deductible fund account \$10,000; liability premium \$19,149; 2009-2010 of \$29,149. A presentation only was done, no action taken.

4. Discussion with possible action on renewal of property; equipment breakdown; inland marine; general liability; employee benefit plans administration liability; law enforcement liability; and auto physical damage insurance to become effective July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010, with the Burrows Agency, Inc. – (***NOTE***this item was skipped on June 15, 2009, meeting***) –

Commissioner Thacker made a motion to recess the meeting for ten (10) minutes with Commissioner DeLozier seconding the motion. Roll Call: Helm-aye, Thacker-aye, DeLozier-aye. Motion carried and the meeting recessed at 10:11 A.M.

Chairman Helm called the recessed meeting back to order at 10:18 A.M. with Commissioner Thacker and Commissioner DeLozier being present and quorum established.

Dave Burrows with Burrows Agency, Inc., stated that he went through the proposal individually with each Commissioner a couple of weeks ago that has been created fro the Board of County Commissioners and the Criminal Justice Authority. One item discussed was the public entity general liability deductible options of \$25,000; \$10,000 or \$5000. Also discussed was flood insurance options and maybe flood insurance for the courthouse only. Burrows continued that the underwriter on the insurance is Traveler's and they have gone beyond and above for the county in the past. Commissioner Thacker stated that Traveler's has represented Rogers County very well in the past and made a motion to approve their insurance proposal as presented with Commissioner DeLozier seconding the motion. Roll Call: Helm-aye, Thacker-aye, DeLozier-aye. Motion carried.

5. Sherri Mount with Welch State Bank was present at the meeting and presented the lease-purchase agreements to the Board for their approval. Chairman Helm made a motion to approve with Commissioner Thacker seconding the motion. Roll Call: Helm-aye, Thackeraye, DeLozier-aye. Motion carried.

6. Presentation by BKL, Inc. to the Board of County Commissioners of Rogers County, Oklahoma, on their qualifications for the upcoming courthouse, 911 Center and jail work –

Kim Reeve, AIA and Billy Knowles, AIA, NCARB, did a presentation to the Board and stated that they are an Oklahoma-based team of architectural and engineering professionals serving Oklahoma government agencies since 1946. Their past architecture experience consists of courthouses, jails, prisons, juvenile detention, police & fire stations, office building, churches and transportation engineering on roads and bridges. County architectures they have been involved in are Mayes County Courthouse; Craig County Courthouse & jail; Ottawa County Courthouse & annex; Payne County Courthouse; Osage County Courthouse; Tulsa District Courts feasibility study; Okmulgee County Courthouse; Logan County Courthouse and Bryan County Courthouse. This item was a presentation only, no action taken.

7. Discussion with possible action on Bid on County Property submitted by Habitat for Humanity Claremore, Inc., on county property described as "the South 50.8 feet of the North 101 feet of Lots 10 & 11 in Block 143 of the Original Town of Claremore" being located in Section 16, Township 21 North, Range 16 East of the I.B.& M., Rogers County, Oklahoma" account #15088 –

Commissioner DeLozier stated that he had talked to County Treasurer, Cahty Baker, and this piece of property had been deeded to the county at re-sale and that Habitat for Humanity Claremore, Inc., had made a bid of \$500 to try and purchase the property. Gene Haynes, District Attorney, stated that this is just an offer being made to buy this particular piece of county property and today the Board would be giving the Treasurer authorization to proceed with the sale. The bid has to be published in the newspaper and other individuals can come in and bid on this piece of they want to. This is just the first step. Commissioner Thacker made a motion to allow Cathy Baker, County Treasurer to proceed in the sell of the property according to the state statute and Commissioner DeLozier seconded the motion. Peggy Armstrong, Rogers County Clerk, explained to the Board that the County Clerk's copier maintenance company had informed them that this particular copier was obsolete and they would not be able to repair it anymore because they could not find parts for it. The Toshiba copier has been traded in on a new Canon 45 cpm digital copier. Chairman Helm made a motion to approve with Commissioner Thacker seconding the motion. Roll Call: Helm-aye, Thacker-aye, DeLozier-aye. Motion carried.

- 25. Discussion with possible action on the request of Candi Czapansky, Court Clerk, for Rogers County to fund four (4) deputy court clerk positions for which state court funds have been eliminated for 2009-2010 fiscal year –

Candi Czapansky, Court Clerk, explained to the Board that the Supreme Court of Oklahoma has cut four (4) court fund employees from her budget and she is requesting the county take over paying of those positions out of general government for salaries only in the amount of \$155,946.24, which does not include FICA and benefits. Czapansky continued that all 77 counties court fund budgets were reduced by 7% for fiscal year 2010. There are 821 deputy court clerk statewide and at least 306 deputy court clerks were paid out of local court funds in fiscal year 2009. That number will shrink to 238 in fiscal year 2010 as a result of a comparative review of statistical data as to the number of deputy court clerk employed in each county; the number of deputy court clerks paid from each local court fund; the assigned duties of each deputy court clerk; the caseload statistics of each district court; and the collections and operating expenses of each district court. Mayes County and Craig County were also hit with budget reductions.

Judge Dewayne Steidley was also present at the meeting and spoke in support of Czapansky, but also stated that many members of the legislature predict that fiscal year 2011 will be even more of a challenge than this year. These savings will allow the judiciary to absorb the reductions imposed by the legislature this year and prepare for an even more difficult budget hearing process in fiscal year 2011.

Commissioner Thacker inquired from Czapansky if she any carry-over money in this year's budget to pay the salaries with? And Czapansky replied, no, but there are funds in other accounts that could be used temporarily until the budget is approved and she would cut in other places where she could. Commissioner DeLozier stated that the county does not know the numbers yet for fiscal year 2010 budget and would not know if the county could afford to take on four (4) more employees. Czapansky stated that she felt she could make it through October by paying those four (4) salaries from other funding sources. Discussion only, no action taken.

26. Discussion with possible action on the decision by the City of Claremore to discontinue funding its portion of the salary and benefits fro the joint position of Rogers County and City of Claremore Director of Emergency Management for the 2009-2010 fiscal year –

Commissioner Thacker read the letter that the Board of County Commissioners received from the City of Claremore, dated June 11, 2009, that due to budget constraints, the City has decided not to continue with the current arrangement with Rogers County regarding the joint use of Mr. Bob Anderson as Emergency Management Director with the commencement of the new fiscal which begins July 1, 2009.

Bob Anderson, Emergency Management Director, explained to the Board that he has the funds to continue to run the Emergency Management Offices at the current status, because he has the \$20,000 for fiscal year 2009 from the City of Claremore coming in this month, it has not been paid yet. Anderson continued that he should be able to run through June 30, 2010, if the state and the county funds his requests for 2009-2010.

Commissioner DeLozier asked Anderson if he was the Emergency Management Director for the City of Claremore and Anderson replied, no, that expires effective June 30, 2009.

City of Claremore Mayor, Brant Shallenburger inquired if the City of Claremore owes for anything, like equipment, etc., and Anderson replied nothing monetary, maybe some computer equipment. Shallenburger continued that the City of Claremore feels they can provide this service themselves due to budget constraints to keep from having to lay off people.

Mark Dowler, City of Claremore Fire Chief, stated that this was one of the last resorts the city took as a matter of economics. Discussion only, no action taken.

Commissioner Thacker expressed his dislike of the use of the charity account by the Commissioner's office and felt there should be no charity account at all. Chairman Helm made a motion to recess the meeting for a 1-hour lunch period and be back at 1:00 P.M. with Commissioner Thacker seconding the motion. Roll Call: Helmaye, Thacker-aye, DeLozier-aye. Motion carried and the meeting recessed until 1:00 P.M. at 11:46 A.M.

Vice-Chairman Thacker called the recessed meeting back to order at 1:11 P.M. with Commissioner DeLozier being present and quorum established. Chairman Helm arrived at 1:23 P.M.
