Helpful Information for District 2 Residents

Reporting Road Problems: Call the District 2 Office at (918) 443-2441.

Culvert Installation

A culvert is a drain or pipe that allows water to flow under a road, railroad, trail, or similar obstruction. Most homes have culverts running underneath their driveway. If you are having drainage issues you may need to have your culvert cleaned out or replaced.

Culverts in District 2 can be **galvanized or smooth steel**. The standard FEMA approved culvert size is a minimum of 12" in diameter and 20' in length for the typical home. Driveways with heavy traffic, large or oversized loads should have a larger and/or longer culvert. Appropriate allowances for drainage should always be a primary consideration also. If the culverts on either side of the property are larger, you should install a similar size to maintain drainage constancy.

To install or replace a culvert you will need to contact the District 2 office at **(918) 443-2441** so we may evaluate your current situation. You are responsible for purchasing the appropriate size and grade for your property needs according to the District's Road Foreman. Culverts range in price according to size and material. Single-walled galvanized aluminum is the least expensive and least durable. Double walled smooth steel is the most durable and most expensive.

After consulting with the District Road Foreman to determine the correct pipe size, you will then need to purchase the pipe and call the District 2 office to arrange for installation. We will create a work order, pick the culvert up from the retailer and install it with necessary gravel. Allow two to three weeks for installation. There is no charge to the homeowner for the installation service.

Water Drainage Issues:

If you have a problem with flooding or other situations caused by excessive water please call the District 2 office. We can re-dig your ditches, clean out the culvert or evaluate if there are any

other available solutions the county can provide. There is no charge to the homeowner for this service.

**Please Note: We can only perform drainage maintenance on County owned right of way (we cannot perform maintenance on private property).*

Solid Waste Disposal Program:

This is a year-round program offered to residents of District 2. The goal is to provide a service for District 2 residents by offering dumpsters in convenient places to dispose of solid waste. The Solid Waste Disposal Program is funded by a combination of tax revenues, grant funding and income received from our Metal Recycling Program. Your help is essential in maintaining both of these programs. You will be required to provide your driver's license showing your address is located within Rogers County. Please note that this is a service for Rogers County residents only; not commercial operations.

Removal of items from dumpsters is **strictly prohibited.*

Furniture, mattresses, carpeting, home remodeling debris, large household items regular trash service won't pick up, brush and stumps, and appliances with refrigerants or CFCs removed.

We DO NOT and CAN NOT Accept:

Household garbage, bagged trash or anything in bags, yard clippings, paint, batteries, caustic chemicals, oil, car & light truck tires *with rims removed*, tractor tires, dead animals, caustic or hazardous materials *of any kind*, materials containing asbestos, cylinders or other containers of compressed gas, containers with oil, gasoline, diesel fuel, hydrocarbons, or any other problematic products.
