Culverts/Water Drainage Issues: A culvert is a pipe or drain structure that allows for the flow of water. Most homes have culverts running underneath their driveway and there are County culverts under roads allowing water to flow under the road to help control drainage. If you are having drainage issues at your home or see problems along our County roads, please contact our office so we can evaluate the situation and determine the best course of action.

New installation or Replacement Culvert: Culverts range in price according to size and material. The property owner is responsible for purchasing the appropriate size and grade for the property needs. The standard culvert size is 12" in diameter and 20' in length for the typical home. Driveways with heavy traffic, oversized loads or farm equipment should have a larger and/or longer culvert. Appropriate allowances for drainage should always be a primary consideration. If the culverts on either side of the property are larger, you should install a similar size to maintain drainage consistency.

After you have purchased the culvert, call the District 3 office, 918-341-2380. We will create a work order, process the required utility locate, pick up the culvert from the supplier, and install it with the necessary materials. Allow a minimum of three to eight weeks or more for installation, depending on the season. There is no charge to the homeowner for the installation service.

The District 3 office can offer size and material suggestions if you have questions. We also have contact information regarding local culvert retailers. PLEASE NOTE: The County can only perform drainage maintenance and/or install culverts within County right of way. Repair or replacement of cement or other ornamental driveway materials is the responsibility of the property owner.

Solid Waste Disposal Program: This is a free, year-round program for County residents to dispose of oversized items from their private residence. The goal of the Solid Waste Disposal Program is to provide a service for County residents and reduce the amount of rural dumping. Items should be of no use to charity organizations and too large for normal trash service pick-up. It is not available for commercial operations, rental property management or other profit-related services. You must provide a valid driver's license showing your Rogers County address.

ACCEPTED: Household items too large for normal trash service pick-up, which are too damaged for donation to charitable organizations, such as large furniture items, mattresses, carpeting, home remodeling debris, T.V.s, appliances with refrigerants or CFCs removed, car and truck tires with rims removed, tree branches, but NO bagged leaves or grass.

NOT ACCEPTED: We do NOT accept anything in trash bags because if it is small enough to fit in a trash bag it will fit in your trash can. We do not accept any sort of household garbage, leaves, paint, batteries, oil, dead animals, caustic or hazardous chemicals or materials of any kind, materials containing asbestos, cylinders or other containers of compressed gas, containers with oil, gasoline, diesel fuel or hydrocarbons, or other problematic products.
