Commissioner Steve Hendrix was elected to serve the Rogers County citizens of District 2 in November 2016, 2020, and 2024 and is currently serving his third term in office. He is a third-generation Rogers County native born in Claremore to Pete and Barbara Hendrix. Commissioner Hendrix graduated from Claremore High School in 1975. After high school, he continued his education at Oklahoma State University, receiving a business degree in Finance. He and his wife Debbie have been married for 34 years, has three children, and five beautiful grandchildren. He is a member of Redeemer Lutheran Church in Claremore.

Prior to being elected Commissioner, he obtained 10 years of experience in the construction and excavation business. He was owner/operator in a family-owned excavation company, which utilized dump trucks, bulldozers, loaders, tractors and other excavating equipment. Job design and working with bids and quotes were a part of the valuable experience that he gained while a part of this company.

Commissioner Hendrix has been CDL licensed for over 30 years. He also has a decade of experience in the Insurance and Financial Services Industry. He was an insurance agent and registered representative for Prudential Insurance and securities licensed with Pruco Securities and worked in the district office in Tulsa before opening an individual office in Claremore.
